WATER/SEWER - The farthest curb stop from the water main will be considered the owner's property and from that point, the owner shall be responsible for maintenance and repair. The sewer lines from the sewer pot to the house are the responsibility of the homeowner. If water meter is damaged due to neglect, it will be the owner's responsibility for the cost of repair and/or replacement by the Village of Glen Park.

SUMP PUMPS SHOULD NOT be used to pump liquid from your residence into the Village sewer system. When this is done, it creates a huge amount of sewage and thereby increases the cost of sewer to all residents. "The owner of the property from which the inflow originated shall be billed for the inflow at the rate per gallon (based upon the Superintendent's estimated number of gallons of inflow) times 2 times the average charge per gallon charged by the Village of Brownville to the Village of Glen Park under their Sewer Service Agreement."

HANDICAPPED PARKING PERMITS - Village Clerk Constance G. Hoard issues, for Village of Glen Park residents only, parking permit hangtags following completion of the application by their doctor for a Temporary or Permanent Disabled Parking Permit. The Permanent Handicapped Parking Permit hangtags expire five years following the date they are last issued. You may call Village Clerk at 315-782-4508 to get a updated hangtag at any time.

**TOWN OF BROWNVILLE AMBULANCE SERVICE –** Guilfoyle Ambulance has contracted with Town of Brownville, Villages of Brownville, Dexter and Glen Park for emergency ambulance services. The Village of Glen Park's share (based on 2010 census of 502) is \$2400.00.- Guilfoyle will respond to all 911 calls in the Town of Brownville.

There is no cost to the residents of the Town of Brownville other than what is billed to their insurance company for emergency calls. Residents would be expected to provide all necessary insurance information to Guilfoyle. Residents would be required to pay for any non-emergency transports requested of Guilfoyle. This contract is from January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021.

**This contract does not include routine transfers to and from residents' homes or hospitals, or to out-of-town hospitals.**

**ZONING PERMITS –WE NEED YOUR HELP!** If you notice any new construction of additions to buildings or sheds, please notify any Village Board member at their phone number so Zoning Permit Applications may be procured from, completed and returned with fee to the Village Office by the present owner of the property involved. The present fee for a Zoning Permit Application is **\$10.00.**

To facilitate any new construction, including accessory buildings such as sheds, please allow sufficient time after submitting and paying for all required zoning permit applications to Treasurer so that the Board of Trustees may coordinate your construction with the side and rear setback regulations for your zoning district and village sewer/and water easements in order to approve and issue the needed Zoning Permit.

For any **Building Permits**, residents are urged to contact Jefferson County Building Code Office (315-785-5130).

**REFUSE NEWS -** The Village of Glen Park has a refuse contract with Pick N Go, 800 Starbuck Avenue, Watertown, NY, 13601 Phone 315-783-4122. **We would like to remind you at this time of the present rules for trash and recycle pickup. AS OF APRIL 1, 2017, THE VILLAGE OF GLEN PARK HAS REQUIRED USE OF CLEAR BAGS FOR REFUSE.** The refuse limit per pickup day is **SIX 33 GAL. CLEAR BAGS NOT TO WEIGH MORE THAN 40 LB. PER BAG.**

**ONLY ON CLEAN UP DAYS, (SPRING AND FALL),** may you place curbside any large items, such as furniture or appliances. Allowing anyone to drop off refuse from outside of the Village of Glen Park is a Vehicle and Traffic Law violation. **WATCH FOR DATE FOR OUR SPRING CLEAN UP DAY IN THE NEXT NEWSLETTER TO BE MAILED TO YOU ON JUNE 1, 2021.**

On **TUESDAY** pickup day, please place refuse containers in your driveway entrance by **6:00 am** Also, please separate normal refuse from those items to be recycled. **RECYCLABLES – CANNOT BE MIXED WITH REFUSE.** All recyclables must be rinsed and cleaned.

**We have been asked by Pick N Go to inform you that cellophane bags, and styrofoam items are not recyclable. Please place them into clear refuse/garbage bags.**

**MATTRESSES, ELECTRONICS AND TIRES WILL NOT BE PICKED UP ON REGULAR PICKUP DAYS NOR CLEAN UP DAYS,**

Residents may also take electronic equipment, mattresses and tires etc. to the Jefferson County

Solid Waste Facility on NYS Route 12 in the Town of Pamela. For hours, fees and other information, please call them at 315-786-6900. DANC conducts annual FREE Household Hazardous Waste Collection Days. Look for information in Watertown Daily Times.

a) All glass, tin, plastic and paper can be placed together in one bin. b) Cardboard must be broken down, flattened, and tied in sizes no larger than 3 feet X 3 feet. Anything larger than 3 feet X 3 feet will not be picked up. c)– Shredded paper should be placed into a clear plastic bag.

The Village Board recommends that trash, while in storage prior to pickup be kept in a type of covered garbage container to prevent dogs, cats, rodents, and birds etc. getting into garbage. If you place your refuse out the night before regular pickup, please use covered containers as required by the Village Refuse Law.

During winter months to assist the refuse contractor in his duties, PLEASE DO NOT PLACE REFUSE ON TOP OF SNOWBANKS OR IN THE ROAD OR SIDEWALKS.

ON CLEAN UP DAY ONLY -residents will be limited to four yards of debris. (a pile which is approx. 6' x 6' x 3'). Please have items ready by 6 am Acceptable items for the curbside pickup: EMPTY paint cans and 5 gallon pails with can tops removed, small furniture - chairs, box springs, household refuse, carpeting, small amounts of construction debris, lumber must be 2' sections.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED ARE LARGE AMOUNTS OF CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS, TIRES AND MATTRESSES. Prepare neatly as many items as possible, in a bag or box, and label any container you wish disposed. Recyclables, such as empty cardboard boxes, will not be picked up on Clean Up Day but will be picked up on the following Tuesday pickup day.

The Public Works Department will pick up white goods and heavy steel or pipe. Metal and plastic must be separated from the other refuse items. These items will not be picked up by the contractor or Village DPW unless all metal and plastic objects, such as legs, are detached from tables etc.

DOG LEASH LAW - There is a dog leash law in the Village of Glen Park and the law is enforced.

DOG LICENSES are issued by Town Clerk June McCartin, Star School House Road, Limerick. Office Hours are: Mon. to Thurs 12-5 p.m. and Fri. 12-4 p.m.

Have you noticed the drop-off sheds at the United Methodist Church parking lots in Dexter and Brownville? Community members may donate usable clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, linens, blankets, curtains and stuffed animals. PLEASE NO RAGS OR FABRIC SCRAPS.

Items must be bagged in tied plastic bags before being placed in shed's drop-off opening. Receipts for tax-deduction are stored in a mailbox on the shed. All items are shipped whole-garment and will be worn by someone, somewhere. Items go to 44 countries, including the United States. The churches receive \$.04 per pound for items placed in these sheds. Churches may access the donations in the sheds for local use at times of community emergency or need.

**SOLICITING OR PEDDLING** -No one should be soliciting within the Village of Glen Park without a Peddling Permit on their person. Please send them to the Village Office at 642 Main Street during office hours or call the Village Clerk anytime at (315-782-4508) to apply for a Peddling Permit. Cost of license is \$25.00 per person, per calendar year. Before issuance of the Peddling Permit, there is a 3-day waiting period after Village of Glen Park receives completed Peddling Permit application and fee.

**VILLAGE BOARD MEETINGS** - First Monday of each month 6 p.m. except in September (due to Labor Day) and other federal holidays, when it will be the second Monday of the month) at the Municipal Complex, 642 Main St. Notices for any additional meetings will be posted in the Bulletin Board at Municipal Complex.
